
Event Overview











Event Analysis

The Alternative Investments Forum gathered a diverse group of participants, with 67% attending for the first time and the remaining 33% being returning delegates. The attendees were asked about their current allocation of alternative assets, and the results indicate a varied distribution across different investment types.


Hedge funds were the most popular alternative asset, with 29.92% of respondents indicating that they allocate funds to this category. Private equity was the second most popular, with 25.98% of respondents currently allocating assets to this type of investment. Private credit followed with 11.02% of participants choosing this option. A significant portion, 22.83%, responded that they do not allocate to any alternative assets, while 10.24% selected "other" as their choice.

The survey also explored the **value of current assets under advice / administration** among the participants. The breakdown of respondents based on asset value ranges is as follows:

•	RO - R500 million:	32.28%
•	R501 - R1 billion:	15.75%
•	R1 - R2 billion:	7.09%
•	R2 - R5 billion:	14.96%
•	Over 5 billion:	29.92%

Regarding the professional roles of the attendees, a diverse mix of individuals were present at the forum. The breakdown of **respondents based on their roles** is as follows:



Overall, the data indicates a significant number of first-time attendees at the Alternative Investments Forum, suggesting a growing interest in exploring alternative asset classes. Hedge funds, private equity, and private credit are the most common alternative investments among the participants. The value of assets under advice/administration varies widely, ranging from smaller portfolios below R500 million to larger portfolios exceeding R5 billion. The diverse range of professional roles represented at the event indicates broad industry participation, encompassing analysts, advisors, managers, trustees, and others with a stake in alternative investments.


